The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) Provides Horse Feed for North Texas Residents Impacted by COVID-19

Free alfalfa hay cubes available thanks to a partnership with the ASPCA®

WHAT: In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) Equine Department is now providing free alfalfa hay cubes for residents struggling to feed their equines. The horse feed is available thanks to a partnership with the ASPCA (The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals®) who provided 44,000 pounds of equine food donated by Standlee Premium Products™ to support this effort.

WHEN: 4 bags of alfalfa hay cubes per owned equine (5 equines max), is available Saturday, June 20th from 9am-2pm, and Saturday and Sunday, June 27th and 28th from 9am-2pm, while supplies last.

WHERE: HSNT Equine Ranch located at 1033 County Road 910, Joshua, TX, 76058.

"The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) is beyond thankful to be able to help communities with families needing assistance for their equine," said Cassie Davidson, Director of Communications for the Humane Society of North Texas.
