## SENIOR DOGS AT THE HUMANE SOCIETY OF NORTH TEXAS FETCH GRANT

## The Humane Society of North Texas Receives \$11,000 Grant from The Grey Muzzle Organization

**AUGUST 29, 2023 | FORT WORTH, TEXAS** – Old dogs have something to wag about this summer as The Grey Muzzle Organization announces the recipients of its annual grants, and the dogs at the Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) are among the winners, receiving an \$11,000 grant.

HSNT is one of 90 animal welfare groups chosen from 370 applicants to receive a grant to help local senior dogs. The winning groups received \$848,000 in grants to help save or improve the lives of at-risk old dogs in their communities.

"This grant will help us give senior dogs like 10-year-old Edgar the veterinary and dental care he needs," said Destiny Vandeput, Director of Communications at HSNT. "No one is more grateful or loving than a senior dog, and we're looking forward to helping more senior dogs get the second chance they all deserve."

Over the past 15 years, the national nonprofit Grey Muzzle Organization has provided more than \$4.6 million in grants to support its vision of "a world where no old dog dies alone and afraid."

"Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we're delighted to help deserving organizations like the Humane Society of North Texas make a difference in the lives of dogs and people in their communities," Grey Muzzle's Executive Director Lisa Lunghofer said. "Many senior dogs in North Texas are enjoying their golden years in loving homes thanks to the wonderful work of HSNT."
