The Humane Society of North Texas Assists the City of Arlington with a Negotiated Release of 21 Dogs

Who: The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) and the Dallas Police Department Animal Cruelty Unit assisted the City of Arlington with a negotiated release and removal of 21 dogs from a one-bedroom apartment in Arlington. The three organizations worked together to ensure the safe harbor of the pets involved. This case is active with an ongoing investigation through the City of Arlington.

Where: Arlington

Why: Dogs were found to be living under inhumane conditions in a one-bedroom apartment in an Arlington apartment and removed by HSNT, Dallas Police Department Animal Cruelty Unit, and Arlington Animal Control. 10 Dogs have been transferred to HSNT, 11 dogs to Arlington Animal Control.

When: Wednesday, June 16th, 2021

Additional Information: The 10 dogs in HSNT's care will be medically evaluated, rehabilitated and eventually available for adoption. The 11 dogs in Arlington's care will also be medically and behaviorally evaluated and examined. Arlington will work with rescues and adopters to ensure that these dogs receive the care and treatment they may need.
