The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) Assists the Hill County Sheriff's Office in Removing More Than 50 Dogs From Deplorable Conditions

On April 12, 2021 The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) Cruelty Department worked alongside the Hill County Sheriff's Department to rescue more than 50 dogs that had been living in unbelievable conditions for quite some time. HSNT's investigators entered the property in Hazmat suits and respirators due to the high levels of ammonia.

More than 50 dogs and puppies were removed from the dilapidated, trash-filled and feces-covered residence, which was still inhabited by the owner. The dogs were infested with fleas and suffered from varying skin issues and hair loss due to the unsanitary living conditions. The dogs also were afflicted with numerous types of intestinal parasites including; hookworms, roundworms, whipworms, and tapeworms. Many of the females were pregnant or had recently given birth. The moms and babies, the youngsters and the aged were all covered in feces with nowhere to escape this torment of living in deplorable conditions—parts of which included approximately 3-feet of compacted urine and fecal matter. Simply stated, it was disgusting.

"It is tiring work. It is grueling work. It seems to never end," said Cassie Davidson, Humane Society of North Texas Director of Communications. "Together we can AND MUST be the voice for so many pets needing our help. You can help us! Please speak up. Make that phone call. Ask questions. Report abuse. All of these dogs are now safe in HSNT's care, currently being treated for their medical ailments and receiving the daily attention they desperately need. Several of the moms have given birth in HSNT's care with more deliveries to come. HSNT is in urgent need of foster heroes and donations to ensure this lifesaving work continues.
